2. Statement of interest for the TC6 Chairmanship position

It took me some time to decide to apply for this position. This is certainly not a goal in my career. Clearly, adding TC6 duties on my agenda will reduce the amount of time remaining for my research activities, which constitute my first priority.

So, why am I applying for this position? Good question! I think the main reason is that I cannot just sit and witness IFIP's decline, and complain about IFIP's poor strategy, while I would like to see IFIP as a prestigious (and truly international) body next to ACM and IEEE. Several TC6 colleagues have also pressured me to step forward (Thanks for your support!).

Chairing TC6 is a very challenging task. During the coming years, I'd like to reach the following objectives:

- Convince the international community that IFIP is still a serious technical body in the networking field.
- Make sure all TC6 WGs are the main/full sponsors (not just one among many cosponsors) of a high level conference in their field, otherwise IFIP's image is too diluted. In addition, TC6 can of course continue to co-sponsor other non-IFIP conferences, if they are of high quality.
- Monitor carefully the quality/impact of all our conferences and react accordingly. IFIP TC6 cannot support conferences that have a poor technical reputation. We should progressively converge towards a small set of reputed events.

- Create lively WG workshops where members are invited to present their work (i.e. kind of Dagstuhl seminars/workshops, just talks, no proceedings, scientists enjoy that a lot), ideally co-located with another conference of the WG. If attractive, these workshops will motivate people to become WG members and will improve IFIP's reputation.
- Make sure the real experts in the field are members of our WGs and remove passive WG members. This is crucial for the reputation of the WG workshops.
- Create a successful TC6 open access journal.
- Create an open access TC6 Digital Library (or use the IFIP DL if any) and establish a procedure to populate it systematically with all papers published by Springer more than 18 months ago.
- Prepare the "after-Springer" time.
- Find a suitable business model for TC6 considering total absence of revenue from publications.
- The TC6 meetings should focus on the main issues above, with clear reporting (with slides that can be archived) and interesting discussions.
- An environment should be set up for archiving the TC6 material and structure the topics (e.g. a wiki).

What I promise **not** to do if I'm elected:

- No IFIP Council: the TC chairs are not members of the IFIP Council anyway.
- I won't be attending the IFIP General Assembly meetings, unless they are held in a location I can reach easily and minimize my stay there to a strict minimum (otherwise another TC6 delegate could substitute me there, as I noticed that five TC6 members are also members of the GA).
- I won't bring TC6 material at the meetings. Ideally there will be an Internet access at the meetings to access documents from the TC6 repository, or the participants will bring electronic/paper copies with them.
- I won't bore you with after-dinner speeches ©

If I'm elected I will rely on your enthusiastic and strong commitment to work with me along these lines. To achieve that, I will follow the recent agreement on TC6 governance, and will nominate a vice-chair, a secretary, a treasurer, and several small committees with clear objectives and responsible chairpersons.

If TC6 only works in bursty mode, every 6 months during the meetings, we will not succeed. The challenges listed above will require active and continuous work from the committee, as well as regular reporting to monitor progress.
