Length of placements: 4-12 months; - Schools - leaving September 06 for 10-11 months; - Caring - leaving September 06 or January 07 for 6-12 months; - Camp Placements – leaving between January and June 07 until the end of August or later; - Caring Camps- (same dates as Camps above); - Marine Biology – leaving September 06 for 4 months

Thailand

Length of placements: The placements run from May or November for 4 - 5 months. **Location:** GAP has placements in central and south Thailand.

Typical accommodation and Food: Volunteers will receive free accommodation on the schools premises where possible, and in teacher's hostels. In some cases, they will share accommodation near to the school provided by teaching staff or friends of the school. As the schools are mostly day schools, lunches and possibly some other meals will be provided free, but as a general rule, volunteers should expect to provide, for themselves, breakfasts, evening meals and all meals at the weekends.

Neuseeland

Length of placements: Placements run from late August 2006 to late August 2007 (12 months). There are also a few places starting in January 07 to August 07. Location: GAP has placements in both the North and South island, mainly in boarding schools, but there are a few in day schools where you live with a host family Typical accommodation: Depending on where you are placed you may be accommodated in a shared apartment, a boarding house within the school, or with a host family. All meals are provided; if not, a food allowance will be given in addition to your living allowance.

Living allowance: The living allowance is in the region of NZ\$100 (approx \in 50) per week. Your living allowance is enough to cover your day-to-day needs and should not be considered as a wage. A GAP placement is a volunteer placement. Please note, during the school holidays you may have to find your own food although your room will remain available.

Insurance: You must have valid travel insurance for the time you are in New Zealand. GAP has an insurance package that has been specially negotiated for GAPpers, however you are free to take alternative insurance.

Indien

Length of placements: The placements run from January / February or September 2006 for 4 - 6 months.

Location: GAP has placements in the North East and North West of India.

Typical accommodation and Food: Free board and lodging are usually provided, though the poorer hosts may ask for a contribution. Host organisations provide board and lodgings either in a separate room on the premises or in a flat or guest house not far away. Living conditions vary, though are often very basic; a bucket shower and squat toilets are the norm and hot water is often unreliable. Food is usually a simple Indian diet, often vegetarian e.g. rice and dhal (lentils) and can be monotonous. Volunteers will need to monitor their own health and maybe supplement their diet with fresh fruit and even vitamin pills.

Living allowance: Unlikely to receive anything. Some placements may require the volunteers to pay an additional contribution towards food – this will be minimal. **Insurance:** You must have valid travel insurance for the time you are in India. GAP strongly recommends an insurance package that has been specially negotiated for GAPpers, however you are at liberty to take alternative insurance.

Visa & flight arrangements: GAP will provide information and assistance with your flight and visa application process once you are accepted into the program.

English fluency: A good command of English must be proven during a telephone interview.

GAP contribution: The GAP contribution of €1400 includes: A managed selection process; The identification and vetting of suitable voluntary work placements in India; Matching you to a suitable placement; Assistance with visa, flight and insurance arrangements; One day briefing/information day in Germany (probably in Bonn in December 2005 / August 2006), travel expenses not included; A two day orientation seminar with full board and lodging on arrival in Delhi. Host families can have very different social and economic circumstances. Living allowance: Living allowance ranges from A\$70 and A\$170 (approx. €40 - €100) with the average about A\$100 per week. Your living allowance is enough to cover your day-to-day needs and should not be considered as a wage. A GAP placement is a volunteer placement.

Insurance: You must have valid travel insurance for the time you are in Australia. GAP strongly recommends an insurance package that has been specially negotiated for GAPpers, however you are at liberty to take alternative insurance

Visa & flight arrangements: GAP will provide information and assistance with your flight and visa application process once you are accepted into the program.

English fluency: A good command of English must be proven during a telephone interview.
